**BERNON BECOT 2019** by **James Suckling** – April 2019 - **91/100**

The 2016 Bernon Bécot is fruity and fun young red with medium body, firm Tannins and a fresh and bright finish. Attractive center palate.

**BERNON BECOT 2019** by **Jeb Dunnuck** – June 2019 - **90-92/100**

The 2019 chateau Bernon Bécot From the same team as Roc de Bécot team, the 2018 chateau Bernon Bécot 2018 is another deeply colored effort that's loaded with fruit and texture.

Cassis, graphite, and damp earth notes give way to a ripe, sexy, medium, to full-bodied 2018 that has no hard edges, solid purity of fruit, and an impeccably balanced style. Both the releases are terrific.

**BERNON BECOT 2019** by **Lisa Perrotti** -june 2020- **89-91+/100**

Opaque purple-black colored, the 2019 Bernon Becot sails out of the glass with fragrant notes of crushed blackberries, black raspberries and morello cherries with hints of red roses, black olives, tilled soil and black tea Medium to full-bodied, the palate is charged with energy, offering vibrant red and black fruits with great freshness and a finely grained texture, finishing long and perfumed

**BERNON BECOT 2019** by **Jeff Leve** – June 2019 - **89/100**

Lushly textured, juicy, ripe and fresh, with soft round tannins, dark chocolate and black cherries from start to finish. This will be delicious on release.

**BERNON BECOT 2019** by **Antonio Galloni** – June 2020 - **86-88/100**

The 2019 Bernon Becot is a forward, fruity wine that should drink well right out of the gate. The 2019 is done in a simple, easygoing and rustic style with inky, dark fruit. This is a wine that has plenty to offer if enjoyed over the near term.

**BERNON BECOT 2019** by **Jeb Dunnuck** – november 2020 - **90-92/100**

The 2019 chateau Bernon Becot is a classic, fresh, almost crunchy effort offering a terrific bouquet of black cherries and cassis interwoven with damp earth, violets, and new leather notes. It's balanced and has a fresh, elegant style, firm tannins, and solid mid-palate depth. It's going to benefit from just short-term cellaring and keep for a decade.
